



Prayer Suggestion

When your soul feels lukewarm or dried up, try praying this prayer.

Many people experience an initial intense conversion where they feel a deep love of God. However, those feelings of love can quickly die out and we can begin questioning our own faith, wondering whether it is worth it.

St. Therese of Lisieux, a Carmelite nun of the 19th century, felt similar feelings of doubt. During her life she had many feelings of love for God, but often those feelings would fade away and she would nearly plunge into despair.

The good news is that she recognized the danger she was in and took a different approach to rekindle her love of God. In this passage below, she prays to God and asks him for help. It is a prayer that can help form our own spiritual life, helping us to realize that we can do little things every day that can help reconnect us with God. In many ways it is the little things that matter in life and can help us persevere during a dry spell, keeping our eyes fixed on God in the midst of a spiritual drought.

Pray this:

O Lord, when I feel nothing, when I am incapable of praying or practicing virtue, then is the moment to look for small occasions, nothings, to give You pleasure. For example, a smile, a friendly word, when I should much prefer to say nothing at all or look bored ...When I find no occasions, at least I want to keep telling You that I love You; it is not difficult and it keeps the fire of love going; even if that fire were to seem wholly out, I should throw little bits of straw on the ashes, little acts of virtue and of charity; and I am sure that, with Your help, the fire would be enkindled again.

Fr Frank Lobo's Incardination


On the somber memorial of Sept. 11, two priests found solace and joy as they celebrated their incardination into the Diocese of Orlando. **Father Frank Lobo**, associate pastor of St. Mary Magdalen Parish in Altamonte Springs and Father David Vargas, parochial administrator at Holy Spirit Parish in Lake Wales, were incardinated into the diocese after coming to Central Florida in 2012.

Bishop Noonan opened the official ceremony thanking the two priests' families and parents, in particular, "for the gift of your sons". He said, "This is a day for us to celebrate all the families and that God has blessed us with two new priests in the Diocese of Orlando whom we hope to have for many, many years." Then, in turn, each priest placed his hand on the bible and pledged his oath (Canon 269) to "be ascribed permanently to the service of this diocese."

Father Frank Lobo was ordained in August 1995, as a diocesan priest in the Diocese of San Cristóbal in Táchira, Venezuela. After much discernment, he asked to live and work in Orlando for three years. He served St. Ann's Parish in Haines City working with Father Robert Mitchell, who came to share in the joy of his incardination. In 2015, he renewed his term and became associate pastor of St. Mary Magdalen Parish in Altamonte Springs.

"The welcome my family and I have received from the bishop and the people of Orlando has been beautiful," said Father Lobo. "Not only for us, but also for all the Venezuelans who are looking for a place to re-start their lives. I look at my former Diocese of San Cristóbal with nostalgia because I love it." Although he misses his homeland and is saddened by its suffering, Father Lobo is quick to add, "I feel this is the continuation of the ministry the Lord gave me. I have confidence in preaching the Gospel to all the nations, from San Cristóbal to Orlando and the entire world – because this area is comprised of a fascinating diversity."

After the incardination, a reception was held for Fr Frank. These pictures were from that celebration.



It's a wonderful thing we do before each meeting, the praying of our Blessed Rosary. On our initial journey of becoming Knights of Columbus, we're presented with a Rosary, wrapped carefully around our praying hands and we're requested to carry this precious string of Rosary beads with us everywhere we may go.

Here's an excerpt from *Aleteia* ... Saint John Paul II called for daily Rosaries for peace and for our family. Pope Francis asked for Rosaries to protect the Church from the devil. But St. Dominic was the first to call for Rosaries — to defeat the Albigensian heresy which, among other things, denied the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Let's do the same.

The Rosary is profoundly Eucharistic.

You can hear echoes of the Eucharist throughout the Rosary. It is clearest in the Fifth Luminous Mystery, the Institution of the Eucharist, but it is everywhere, from the chalice in the Agony in the Garden to the Ascension promise, "Behold, I am with you always." But I think the Joyful Mysteries help illuminate the Eucharist most of all.

The First Joyful Mystery: The Eucharist and the Annunciation.

The Church teaches that Jesus Christ is truly present, body, blood, soul and divinity, in the Eucharist. The host just *looks* like bread — it has become the Body of Christ.

People may find it difficult to believe that Jesus Christ, son of the Living God, would be present in such a plain, undifferentiated way. But sustained reflection on the Annunciation mystery — the moment Mary became pregnant with Jesus Christ — solves that problem. After all, the Annunciation is the moment that "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." We can learn from Mary's attitude what the moment of consecration should be like: Humble gratitude and awe.

The Second Joyful Mystery: The Real Presence and the Visitation.

Another problem people might have with the Eucharist is the simple question, Why? Why would Jesus Christ want us to consume him in Communion? It seems odd. But the answer to that question is actually very profound: "The Eucharist makes the Church," as the Catechism puts it. We receive the body of Christ so that we can become the Body of Christ, doing his work in the world. It couldn't be clearer: We receive Jesus into our bodies, and then are dismissed out into the world to do his work. Mary is the supreme example of this. In her "Visitation" to Elizabeth, Jesus Christ inside her animated her efforts to serve her cousin, and her cousin recognized the Lord present in her.

The Third Joyful Mystery: The Birth of Jesus and adoration.

But the Eucharist is not just something we *receive* in Communion. We also *adore* Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in our churches. Think of what it meant for shepherds to leave their flocks to adore an infant, or for the Magi to travel many miles to prostrate themselves before a baby's crib. The *very presence* of Jesus, the Second Person of the Trinity, was enough to inspire grown men — and a host of angels — to gather around a sleeping baby. And his Real Presence in the sacrament is enough to gather us around the tabernacle today.

The Fourth Joyful Mystery: The Presentation and the Temple of our Bodies.

One of the earliest testimonies to the Eucharist is from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. Paul recounts the Institution of the Eucharist and says it is vitally important to "discern the body" of Christ in Communion. Later on in that letter, he gives a good reason why we need to be so careful with the Eucharist: Our bodies are "temples of the Holy Spirit," he says.

The Fourth Joyful Mystery focuses on Mary and Joseph's solemn Presentation of Jesus in the temple of Jerusalem. The care that they take to do what their faith proscribed is a good lesson for us: We need to bring Jesus into the temple of our own bodies with the same care. And once we do, we can have the same reaction Simeon had after his encounter with Jesus: "Now you may let your servant go in peace ... for my eyes have seen your salvation."

The Fifth Joyful Mystery: Finding Jesus in the tabernacle.

But of all the joyful mysteries, the one where I find the most Eucharistic meaning in is the Finding of the Temple. In the original story, Joseph and Mary lose their son and look for him first among their family, who are returning from a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. They don't find him there, so they go back and there he is, in the Temple, sharing his wisdom with the teachers there. This is a perfect analogy for what the Eucharist is for us. When we can't find Jesus in our lives, there is one place we can always find him: In the tabernacle. There he waits, ready to ask and answer questions just as he did so many years ago.
