Our Council just completed our annual Vocations Fundraiser. Thanks to God, and to all of our donors, we had a very successful campaign this year, receiving **\$5,113**. We will distribute \$2,000 to each of 3 seminarians that we support financially to help with their education expenses. May God bring us more priests and bless us for helping these seminarians.

I was asked if the Knights could serve refreshments after all 6 masses on Sat/Sun October 15/16. It started with just 6 volunteers making coffee and lemonade for each mass. I sent an email out asking for volunteers and 2 days later, there were no replies. I then found out that we also needed to serve donuts and cookies after each mass. Now the number of volunteers increased to 20. With help from the SMM Office, I organized the activities that would be involved. I sent out another email and prayed. One of the most challenging aspects of organizing an event is not knowing if we will get enough volunteers. This then becomes a test of my faith and belief that when I ask God to provide volunteers with expectant faith, he answers my prayers. This is stressful especially when the response for volunteers comes in slowly. I know that I need to fully depend on Jesus and trust in him. So, I continued to ask and pray that the Lord would inspire Knights to volunteer. Well, God answered my prayers and we had enough volunteers to help with each Mass. I'm also learning to have faith in a dedicated group of Knights who always volunteer for our events. If you struggle with trusting in the Lord at times, perhaps these short prayers may help increase your faith.

- One thing I have found helpful is to keep repeating: No fear. No worry. No doubt. Jesus is my Security now and always.
- "Lord Jesus, you have the words of everlasting life. Help me to cast aside all doubt and fear so that I may freely embrace your word with complete trust and joy. I surrender all to you. My Brother Knights,

I was running a bit late in getting my thoughts put together so that our Grand Knight could finish publishing our Pinta Log newsletter with my article. For some reason the 1980s came to mind and I started thinking what television programs and music we listened to back 40 short years ago. It wasn't that long ago but it was the era of Michael Jackson, Aerosmith, Journey, Queen, Kiss, Chicago, Rolling Stones and so many others. TV programs like Cheers, Miami Vice, Hill Street Blues, Happy Days and Laverne & Shirley. Back then, and it wasn't that long ago, a new home in this area was around \$47,000. You could buy a gallon of gas for \$1.19 and a dozen

eggs would cost you less than \$1.00. Yes, in many ways, things have changed and especially now between the COVID pandemic and our current financial situation. Back in the 80's, that year the world population was about 4.6 billion people. I know that number doesn't seem very exciting but consider that 4.6 billion people are using social media worldwide today.

The hunger to see and be seen has in many minds infected our world. People want to know how many followers they have, how many likes. They're on Facebook, Instagram and other programs. It seems that our addiction to social media is on the rise while our attention spans are on the decline. On any given day, you can go to a restaurant and if there are eight people sitting down for lunch or dinner you can be sure at least 50% of them are on their cell phones texting or looking up data. I do realize that parents of young children have lost their ability to convince them to use the little coloring book and crayons rather than bringing in their iPad.

And in the midst of all of this, we are losing our sense of identity. We all know that Jesus invites us to a better way, to a life more abundantly. Take a moment and think about his 12 Apostles. Sure, we know a few of them like Peter, James, John, Matthew, and Bartholomew. Most of us couldn't list all of them at our age yet their cohort turned "the world upside down." Check out acts 17:6.

My Brother Knights, we don't need to be famous, we only need to be faithful. We don't need cultural visibility. We need to walk boldly in our identity as sons and daughters of Jesus Christ. We all know that he paid the ransom for us.

When you get a chance, read about the miraculous catch of fish in John chapter 21. You will read that the apostles caught 153 fish. What's so significant about 153 fish? Well, that number isn't just another statistic. It points to our identity in the Messiah, in Jesus. That number of 153 equals in Hebrew writing, equates to "children of God." This detail not only deepens our confidence in Holy Scripture, it also deepens our confidence in who we are. We may feel unseen. We may not have a lot of followers on social media. We may even feel distanced because we are not even that engaged in this digital village on the Internet. But one thing that does matter is this: we matter to God. We belong to him. We are God's favorite.

Now, let's go out into all the world and turn it upside down in Jesus Christ's name and show our generosity to all those, his people. If you are not already in a small group, take the plunge and give it a try. You'll be glad you did.

Top 10 Facts to Know About Long-Term Care Planning

November is National Long-Term Care Awareness Month, an event recognized by Congress and a number of States. To mark the occasion, here are 10 interesting facts shared by the American Association for Long-Term Care Insurance.

- 1. Americans are living longer, in large part due to advances in medical care and public health. Life expectancy in the US for those reaching 65 was 20 years on average in 2019.
- 2. By 2030, one in five residents in the US will be age 65 or older.
- 3. The number of people in need of long-term support services (LTSS) in the United States is already at 14 million and expected to grow to 27 million by 2050.
- Average out-of-pocket costs are \$140,000 for those individuals who utilize paid long term support services (LTSS). Roughly 17 percent will spend over \$100,000 on LTSS. Almost 9 percent will spend over \$250,000 on LTSS.
- 5. By 2040, the total prevalence of Alzheimer's disease and related dementias in the US is expected to approximately double from 7.2 million to nearly 13 million, with 8.5 million women and 4.5 million men expected to develop dementia.
- For those requiring high levels of LTSS, individuals and families pay 55 percent of long-term care costs out of pocket.
- 7. Currently, the majority of older single-person households are female. Women comprised 74 percent of solo households age 80 and over.
- 8. Some 7.5 million Americans have some form of long-term care insurance. Two-thirds of all new individual long-term care insurance claims pay for care needed by women.
- 9. The long-term care insurance industry paid out \$11 billion in benefits to some 310,000 individuals with insurance protection in 2019. The number will increase each year as the current number of policyholders grow older and, as a result, are more likely to begin their claim.
- 10. 69.5 percent of new claims start after the policyholder reached age 80. If you live a long life, you are very likely to need long term care. You'll be very glad you have a policy to pay benefits.
