Worthy Brother Knights, The Personal Meaning of Easter

At the height of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the priest holds Jesus aloft, saying, "Through Him and with Him and in Him, o God almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is Yours, for ever and ever; Amen."

Paul declares to the Colossians:

"He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross." [1 Colossians, 15-20]

The mystery of Jesus, God Incarnate, the living reconciliation of God and man, His life, death, and resurrection - is so meaningful that we physically enter into the seasons of Lent and Easter so we may dig deeper and participate (at least partially) in His glorious sufferings and resurrection.

The Father shows us the depth of His pursuit of us. He wills that His incarnate Son, Jesus, lays down His life for us and never leaves us.

We are grafted onto Him, through baptism and therefore call God the Father, "Abba."

Jesus says, "I will always be with you." He is always with us - particularly in the most Holy Eucharist, through the Mass, the re-presentation of His sacrificial life, death, and resurrection.

He feeds us with his "laid down Life."

There is nothing more personal and nothing more meaningful than that!

Dear Brothers,

Happy Easter!

Lent has been marked by the witness of our brothers. We saw in our Council, Knights who put all their talents at the service of our community; committed to the liturgical services of our parish, with attention to the poor, involved in the preparation of fish fried dinners, men active in defense and promotion of life events, offering their prayers in Eucharistic adoration ... thank you brothers because we have encouraged each other in the path of faith.

After the Lenten journey, we celebrated the Paschal Triduum with the joy of proclaiming Jesus' victory, the Risen one shows himself far above the dominion of sin and death. Now is the time to live these fifty days of Easter with our eyes fixed on the Pentecost Solemnity, so that we can prepare ourselves to be witnesses of the gift of the Holy Spirit sent in order to accomplish God's plan.

"The Spirit prepares men and goes out to them with his grace, in order to draw them to Christ. The Spirit manifests the risen Lord to them, recalls his word to them and opens their minds to the understanding of his Death and Resurrection. He makes present the mystery of Christ, supremely in the Eucharist, in order to reconcile them, to bring them into communion with God, that they may "bear much fruit." (CCC 737)

The parish's message for the Easter season will allow us to live each week in relation to the gift of the Holy Spirit. So each week we will be reflecting on one of the seven gifts that the third person of the Holy Trinity gives us. Thus, we want to emphasize that the message of the Risen Lord can only be transmitted to all generations through the gift that comes to us from heaven. This will be a way to contextualize the challenge of the month, proposed by our supreme chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori who invites us to identify and undertake one way you can be more fruitful. He presents us this question:

What fruit do you currently bear — in your marriage and family, in your relationships at work or among friends, and in the broader community? Are you mindful of the needs of those around you and the opportunities they present to bear fruit? Are there things you can do to become still more fruitful in your Christian witness?

How joyful is the Knight who can count on brothers who invite him and help him to be close to the Risen One. Together let us invoke the Divine Spirit during this Easter so that we can always say: Vivat Jesus!

My Brothers in Faith,

In Father Duberney's Chaplain's message, he writes "we can prepare ourselves to be witnesses of the gift of the Holy Spirit sent in order to accomplish God's plan." What is God's plan for us? To evangelize! If you are a cradle Catholic like me, you may find it challenging to spread the good news of the Lord, to share your faith with others ... to evangelize.

From the April 2 meditation in Word Among Us, "In his 1975 apostolic exhortation on evangelization, Pope St. Paul VI described it this way: "The Holy Spirit places on [the evangelizer's] lips the words which he could not find by himself, and at the same time the Holy Spirit predisposes the soul of the hearer to be open and receptive to the Good News" (*Evangelii Nuntiandi*, 75).

This is great news, especially for those of us who might shy away from the call to share our faith. The Holy Spirit is the ultimate evangelizer, not us. When you greet a neighbor or coworker, the Spirit is already there, communicating the joy of the Lord. When you offer words of compassion to a friend facing hardship, the Spirit is there, helping your friend to sense Christ's love through you. And when the opportunity arises for you to share "a reason for your hope" (1 Peter 3:15), the Spirit is there, giving life to your words, just as he did for Peter on the day of Pentecost. Never underestimate the power of the Spirit! He is always with you, ready to give you courage and boldness. And he always goes ahead of you, preparing the hearts of the people you will meet today. The more you learn to yield to him, the more powerfully you'll see him work.

"Holy Spirit, teach me how to share the power and promise of the gospel!"

We need to pray and ask the Holy Spirit for His saving grace, His strength, His courage and His boldness to overcome our fears. Have faith in the Holy Spirit, believe that He will help you and be with you. Start with small steps. For example, if someone tells you about someone who needs prayer, instead of saying you will pray for that person, stop and offer a prayer right there and then. It can be short, like "Let's pray for xxx's (name), asking the Lord to heal him/her", followed by reciting the Our Father prayer. Believe the Holy Spirit will give you the words to say. Each time you do this, you become more confident and bold. This article is one of the steps I'm taking to evangelize.

May God bless you and your family through this Easter season!

I'm going to really have to buckle down and try to find the time to balance all my priorities. This will mean staying up later, waking up earlier, and cutting out any non-essentials in my schedule. You can't be soft and be a council leader."***

In the weeks ahead, please consider the gifts you can offer in service with the "strong right arm of the Church." You will have the temporal and spiritual support of brother Knights within your council and district, the Florida State Council, and our brethren nationwide and worldwide. Happy Birthday Brother Knights!

Thank you Jesus. Thank you Jesus. Thank you Jesus. Amen. This year's Fish Fry Dinners were very successful! God provided us with our many customers and many talented men and women who worked together to create, serve and cleanup after each of the six dinners. Many of our customers were regular weekly attendees and I thank them for their loyal support. Thank you to everyone who was involved or came to our dinners and thank you for your generosity, both in time and money!

Highlights:

- We had budgeted \$6,000 in profit and ended up with around \$8,200. The only outstanding expense at this time is the charge for propane. This will enable us to cover most of our budgeted deficit and allow us to donate to our designated Council charities. This compares to \$5,500 in profit last year.
- Income was \$800 higher and expenses were \$1,865 less than last year
- There was an average of 278 dinners served for each of the six weeks
- Total diners served in 2024: 1,669, the largest number of dinners served according to my records and 32 more than the 1,637 served in 2023.
- 50/50 revenue: \$734
- Vocations donations: \$399
- 20 free dinners on the Knights and \$375 received in donations

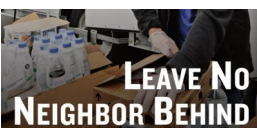


The winner of the last month's \$150 pot was Joe Pullara, and he was present at the meeting! **Yea! Congratulations Joe!**
